

## **FROM THE PASTOR DESK**



**Saints Peter & Paul** - Today we celebrate two apostles who are truly pillars of Christianity. Peter was leader of the Twelve and chief and prince of the Apostles. Peter is also known as the Rock. Whereas Paul came to be known as the Apostle to the Gentiles. Today on their feast day, we honor them as founders of the Church of Rome. Separately they suffered martyrdom in Rome during the reign of Emperor Nero. Today two magnificent basilicas mark their tombs - St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City and St. Paul Outside the Walls.

**Peter the Rock** - originally named Simon, Peter was a fisherman from Bethsaida in Galilee. At Caesarea Philippi, Jesus bestowed upon Simon a new name, Peter, meaning "The Rock." Jesus declared, "*You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of Hell shall not prevail against it*" (Matthew 16:18). Yet, Peter experienced times of human frailty; notably he denied Jesus three times during the Passion. However, following Jesus' resurrection, Peter reaffirmed his love and commitment to Christ, solidifying his role as the leader of the apostles (John 21:15).


Peter showed his leadership: after the Ascension of Jesus, he directed the election of Matthias to replace Judas. Peter boldly proclaimed Jesus as the Messiah. His ministry was marked by miracles, such as healing a man crippled from birth (Acts 3:5) and facilitating the coming of the Holy Spirit in the house of Cornelius (Acts 10:44). After the Council of Jerusalem in 49 AD, Peter traveled to Rome to preach the Gospel. Tradition holds that Peter was crucified on what is now Vatican Hill in Rome in the year 64 AD.

**Paul Apostle to the Gentiles** - formerly known as Saul, he was a zealous Pharisee from Tarsus. No doubt his transformation from a fierce persecutor to a devoted apostle of Christ must be one of the most striking conversions in the Bible. On the road to Damascus to arrest Christians, Paul experienced a divine vision of Christ; it led to his conversion (Acts 9:18).

Paul dedicated his life to spreading the Good News throughout Asia Minor (present day Türkiye) and Greece, establishing numerous Christian communities. His epistles, known as the Letters of St. Paul, form a great portion of the New Testament. During his final visit to Jerusalem, Paul was arrested by Jewish authorities. He was charged with blasphemy. So, as a Roman citizen, he exercised his right to appeal to the emperor and was sent to Rome. From captivity he reflected on his life's work, stating, "*The time has come for me to be gone. I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith*" (2 Timothy 4:6-7). Paul was beheaded along the Ostiense Way around the year 67 AD. So today in a special way we honor these two foundational members of the Catholic Church.

## **DEL ESCRITORIO DEL PARROCO**



**Santos Pedro y Pablo** - Hoy celebramos a dos apóstoles, verdaderos pilares del cristianismo. Pedro fue líder de los Doce y jefe y príncipe de los Apóstoles. Pedro también es conocido como la Roca, mientras que Pablo llegó a ser conocido como el Apóstol de los Gentiles. Hoy, en su festividad, los honramos como fundadores de la Iglesia de Roma. Sufrieron martirio en Roma durante el reinado del emperador Nerón. Hoy, dos magníficas basílicas marcan sus tumbas: la Basílica de San Pedro en la Ciudad del Vaticano y la de San Pablo Extramuros.

**Pedro la Roca:** originalmente llamado Simón, era pescador de Betsaida en Galilea. En Cesarea de Filipo, Jesús le dio a Simón un nuevo nombre: Pedro, que significa "La Roca". Jesús declaró: "*Tú eres Pedro, y sobre esta roca edificaré mi Iglesia, y las puertas del infierno no prevalecerán contra ella*" (Mateo 16:18). Sin embargo, Pedro experimentó momentos de fragilidad humana; en particular, negó a Jesús tres veces durante la Pasión. Sin embargo, tras la resurrección de Jesús, Pedro reafirmó su amor y compromiso con Cristo, consolidando su papel como líder de los apóstoles (Juan 21:15).

Pedro demostró su liderazgo: tras la Ascensión de Jesús, dirigió la elección de Matías para reemplazar a Judas. Pedro proclamó con valentía a Jesús como el Mesías. Su ministerio estuvo marcado por milagros, como la curación de un hombre paralítico de nacimiento (Hechos 3:5) y la venida del Espíritu Santo a la casa de Cornelio (Hechos 10:44). Tras el Concilio de Jerusalén en el año 49 d. C., Pedro viajó a Roma para predicar el Evangelio. La tradición sostiene que Pedro fue crucificado en lo que hoy es el Monte Vaticano en Roma en el año 64 d. C.

**Pablo, apóstol de los gentiles,** antes conocido como Saulo, fue un celoso fariseo de Tarso. Sin duda, su transformación de feroz perseguidor a devoto apóstol de Cristo debe ser una de las conversiones más impactantes de la Biblia. Camino a Damasco para arrestar a los cristianos, Pablo tuvo una visión divina de Cristo, la cual lo condujo a su conversión (Hechos 9:18).

Pablo dedicó su vida a difundir la Buena Nueva por Asia Menor (actual Turquía) y Grecia, estableciendo numerosas comunidades cristianas. Sus epístolas, conocidas como las Cartas de San Pablo, constituyen gran parte del Nuevo Testamento. Durante su última visita a Jerusalén, Pablo fue arrestado por las autoridades judías. Fue acusado de blasfemia. Por lo tanto, como ciudadano romano, ejerció su derecho a apelar al emperador y fue enviado a Roma. Desde su cautiverio, reflexionó sobre la obra de su vida, afirmando: «*Ha llegado mi hora de partir. He peleado la buena batalla hasta el final; he corrido la carrera hasta la meta; he guardado la fe*» (2 Timoteo 4:6-7). Pablo fue decapitado en la Vía Ostiense alrededor del año 67 d. C. Por eso, hoy honramos de manera especial a estos dos miembros fundadores de la Iglesia Católica. **Padre Carlos.**

**Rome: Pallium is Conferred Today**, Sunday June 29, 2025, on the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Pope Leo XIV will preside over Holy Mass in St. Peter's Basilica at 9:30 a.m. During the Mass, he will personally bless and bestow the Pallia upon the new Metropolitan Archbishops, restoring a tradition that had been suspended in 2015. With the decision of Pope Leo XIV, the universal Church now witnesses the return of a liturgical form replete with meaning from many centuries of practice. The new archbishops will once more receive the pallium from the hands of the Successor of Peter, in the very place of his tomb.



The pallium is a white woolen liturgical 'stole' adorned with six black crosses, represents the special bond between the Pope and the Metropolitan Archbishops. It is a symbol of the bond of communion with the Apostolic See. It is not a mere ornament, but a true symbol that expresses unity in faith and in pastoral mission.



Historically, the pallium is one of the most ancient liturgical vestments still in use. Its origins date back to Roman times, but it was adopted by the Church to signify the yoke of pastoral responsibility of certain bishops. It is worn over the chasuble and reminds the bishop of his mission as a shepherd, teacher and servant of the People of God. The pallium is always made from lamb's wool, a symbol of Christ the Good Shepherd. The wool comes from lambs that are raised by the Trappist Monks of the Abbey of Three fountains in Rome. By tradition, the wool is spun by the nuns of Saint Cecilia in Trastevere. The ceremony of blessing these lambs takes place by the Pope on the Feast of Saint Agnes, January 21. Although this year, Pope Francis was unable to carry out this task out due to illness. I for one am happy to see this ancient tradition once more carried out in the Eternal City of Rome. I am also very happy that Archbishop Shawn McKnight of Kansas City Archdiocese will be one of several to receive the pallium.

**Roma: Se confiere el palio.** Hoy, domingo 29 de junio de 2025, en la Solemnidad de los Santos



Pedro y Pablo, el Papa León XIV presidirá la Santa Misa en la Basílica de San Pedro a las 9:30 h. Durante la Misa, bendecirá personalmente e impondrá el palio a los nuevos Arzobispos Metropolitanos, restaurando una tradición suspendida en 2015. Con la decisión del Papa León XIV, la Iglesia universal presencia el regreso de una forma litúrgica llena de significado tras siglos de práctica. Los nuevos arzobispos recibirán de nuevo el palio de manos del Sucesor de Pedro, en el mismo lugar de su tumba.

El palio es una estola litúrgica de lana blanca adornada con seis cruces negras y representa el vínculo especial entre el Papa y los Arzobispos Metropolitanos. Es un símbolo del vínculo de comunión con la Sede Apostólica. No es un simple adorno, sino un verdadero símbolo que expresa la unidad en la fe y en la misión pastoral.



Históricamente, el palio es una de las vestimentas litúrgicas más antiguas que aún se usan. Sus orígenes se remontan a la época romana, pero fue adoptado por la Iglesia para representar el yugo de la responsabilidad pastoral de ciertos obispos. Se usa sobre la casulla y recuerda al obispo su misión como pastor, maestro y servidor del Pueblo de Dios. El palio siempre se confecciona con lana de cordero, símbolo de Cristo, el Buen Pastor. La lana proviene de corderos criados por los monjes trapenses de la Abadía de las Tres Fuentes en Roma. Tradicionalmente, la lana es hilada por las monjas de Santa Cecilia en Trastevere. La ceremonia de bendición de estos corderos la realiza el Papa en la festividad de Santa Inés, el 21 de enero. Aunque este año, el Papa Francisco no pudo realizar esta tarea debido a una enfermedad, me alegra ver que esta antigua tradición se lleva a cabo una vez más en la Ciudad Eterna de Roma. También me alegra mucho que el arzobispo Shawn McKnight, de la Arquidiócesis de Kansas City, sea uno de los varios que recibirán el palio. **Padre Carlos**
